WHEREAS, as noted by the City Council in its resolution of 2008-10, the City of Yonkers is committed to the safety of its citizens and the protection of its infrastructure, and

WHEREAS, highway safety is a major concern of the City of Yonkers, and the use of red light cameras is a proven method of reducing traffic fatalities and injuries, and

WHEREAS, the City of New York has implemented a program of red light cameras to reduce traffic fatalities and injuries, and the City of Yonkers has a similar program in place, and

WHEREAS, the City of Yonkers is committed to the safety of its citizens and the protection of its infrastructure, and

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RESOLUTION 39-2009

1. BY COUNCIL PRESIDENT LESNICK, MAJORITY LEADER ANNABI, MINORITY LEADER McLAUGHLIN, COUNCILMEMBERS McDOW, GRONOWSKI AND BARBATO:

WHEREAS, as noted by the Insurance Institute for Highway Safety, running red lights and other aggressive driving tactics are significant factors contributing to the increase in the percentage of intersection related fatalities; and

WHEREAS, highway safety statistics indicate that these accidents, even when not fatal, can be very significant, because they often involve excessive speed and right-angle impact; and

WHEREAS, the City of New York currently utilizes "Red Light Cameras" as a means of traffic control and enforcement within the City of New York and also creates a civil liability against the owners of those cars photographed by the "Red Light Cameras"; and

WHEREAS, this arrangement has proven to be very successful in New York City as a means of traffic control and public safety; and

WHEREAS, amending the State laws to allow the City of Yonkers to utilize "Red Light Cameras" would be similarly beneficial; and

WHEREAS, Senate Bill S.3745 and Assembly Bill A.7330 have been introduced to the Legislature, acts which will amend the various State Laws to allow the City of Yonkers to implement a program imposing monetary liability upon vehicle owners for failure to comply with traffic control indicators in the City of Yonkers and to empower the City of Yonkers to install and operate traffic-control signal photo-monitoring devices at intersections.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Yonkers hereby declares that the enactment of S.3745 and A.7330 , or any amended version thereof, to amend various State Laws to implement a program to empower the City of Yonkers to install and operate traffic-control signal photo-monitoring devices at intersections and

to impose monetary liability upon vehicle owners for failure to comply with the law, is in the best interests of the City: and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Council requests the City Clerk to forward a copy of this Home Rule Request Message to the Legislature of the State of New York requesting the passage of the aforesaid bills.
